Tigers Poised for More in 2007

The Tigers are coming off one of their best seasons in school history, qualifying for the NAIA regional tournament for the first time. Doane finished with a 28-29 overall record and 14-10 in the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC). The Tigers lose two players to graduation but return every starting position player. Head Coach Barry Mosley returns for his fourth year. He has a 56-88 record as the Tigers' coach. His coaching staff remains in tact with Don Miller, John Weihe and Billy Baugh returning.

Coach's Outlook

"Ultimate success for any team comes down to team chemistry," said Mosley. "The team has been working and hanging out together ever since the fall season ended. Maintaining that type of commitment and dedication is important as we strive for improvement with each game."

"Obviously it would be very easy to say we just want to see continued improvement in all phases of the game. However, coming off last season, it isn't that easy. Sneaking up on the higher ranked teams is no longer a possibility or an option for us. Our opponents now recognize our talent, the direction the program is headed, and they're now more familiar with our tenancies."

"Based on the kids we have, their talent and their learning capacity, I feel that we'll challenge for one of the top three spots in the conference."

Infield

Pamela Masker, junior first baseman, led the Tiger power hitters with a team-high six home runs last year. She also drew a team best 24 base-on-balls. Masker posted a .979 fielding percentage, tops on the team. She was named honorable mention All-GPAC.

Halea Messersmith, junior second baseman, started 55 of 56 games played. She batted .278 with 15 runs batted in and 27 runs scored, all career highs. She recorded a .923 fielding percentage.

Amber Remmers, sophomore shortstop, had an up and down first year. She batted .266 and finished second on the team with 32 runs batted in. She also scored 30 runs and stole eight bases. She looks to improve on her 23 errors. Despite the errors, she still posted a .912 fielding percentage.

Joy Vasa, junior third baseman, was one of the most productive Tigers while earning First Team All-GPAC and All-Region III honors. Vasa batted .407 and led the team with 43 runs batted in and a .535 slugging percentage. She also led the team with 11 sacrifice hits. Vasa finished with a .948 fielding percentage.

Alyssa Ledon, sophomore catcher, put together a strong second half of the 2006 season and finished with a .357 batting average. She collected 61 hits, including a team best five triples. She was named Second Team All-GPAC.

Outfield

Mindy Nguyen, sophomore, got her first season as a Tiger off to a quick start, setting a school record with 55 stolen bases in a single season. She also led the team with a .411 batting average, 74 hits and 51 runs scored. Nguyen was named First Team All-GPAC.

Amy Hamik, junior, also used her quickness on the base paths, stealing 28 bases. She finished with a .318 average and team-high 16 doubles. She led the outfielders with five defensive assists and 69 putouts. She was named Second Team All-GPAC.



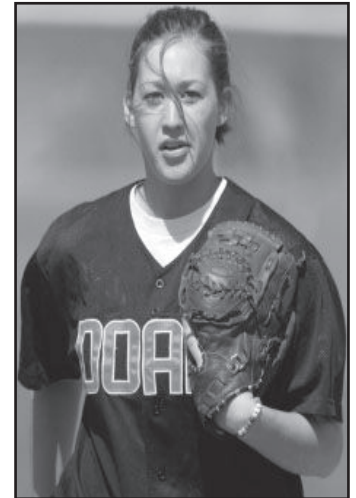
